



DOUBLE DEGREE PROGRAM with Nord University, Bodø/ Norway



Double Degree	Students of the Master's program in International Finance and Economics (M-IFE) at the Ohm can earn two Master's degrees within two years: Master in Business, major Finance and Investments (M.Sc., 120 ECTS), delivered by Nord University and Master in International Finance and Economics (M.Sc., 90 ECTS) delivered by the Ohm
Why a Double Degree?	 Two full degrees within two years International exposure Unique experience abroad Increased job prospects Personal development
Key points	 The double degree includes two semesters of academic studies at Nord University: Students from Ohm will attend their 3rd and 4th semester (if MIFE start was in winter semester) or their 2nd and 3rd semester (if MIFE start was in summer semester) at Nord. Upon successful completion of the double degree requirements (120 ECTS), two separate diplomas are conferred to the student according to the local regulations: The degree from the Ohm: Master in International Finance and Economics (M.Sc.) together with a diploma supplement and transcript of records. The degree from Nord: Master in Business, major Finance and Investments (M.Sc.) together with a diploma supplement and transcript of records. The final grade for Ohm students is based on:

• Master thesis (in English and in the field of economics or finance): MIFE students have to prepare, conclude and submit the Master's thesis jointly at the Ohm and Nord. First supervisor for MIFE students is a Ohm professor, who sets the topic of the Master thesis, and second supervisor is a Nord professor. Grading of the thesis of MIFE students is performed jointly by both supervisors.

The thesis is normally submitted in the last half of May. The semester is finished after this. Students are welcome to join the graduation ceremony which takes place 2-3 weeks after the submission deadline.

- You remain enrolled at Technische Hochschule Nürnberg while being registered at Nord University for the mobility period. Students will pay tuition fees, if any, to their home institution, not the host institution. However, administrative fees etc. might occur at the host institution, which have to be paid by students. Students of Technische Hochschule Nürnberg must pay the semester fee at Nord University, which is currently at NOK 815.
- Students who failed one or more exams at the host institution are required to retake the respective exams at the host institution, where rules and regulations at the host institutions apply. At Nord, students have three attempts for an exam.

Program structure

Ohm students will spend two semesters at Nord University:

- Autumn/Winter semester (from mid-August to mid/end of December)
- Spring/Summer semester (from the beginning of January until end of June)

- Elective 1 (Finance or Economics)

- Elective 3 (Finance or Economics)

Who can participate?

- Students must be enrolled in Ohm's Master Program in International Finance and Economics
- Selection criteria are grades, language skills and motivation.

If successful, the IO will nominate you at Nord University and provide you with further information on the external application procedure of our partner university.

- Exam Period: Nov Dec (autumn); May Jun (spring)


Timeline

Students starting MIFE in summer semester who wish to spend their 2nd and 3rd semester in Norway would apply with their admission letter before being an enrolled Ohm student. Optionally, they could integrate a voluntary internship in their 2nd semester (leave of absence not counted towards study period) and would travel to Norway one year later.

Bodø campus

The city of Bodø has approx. 58,000 inhabitants and is located just north of the Arctic Circle where the mid-night sun is visible 4 June to 8 July.
