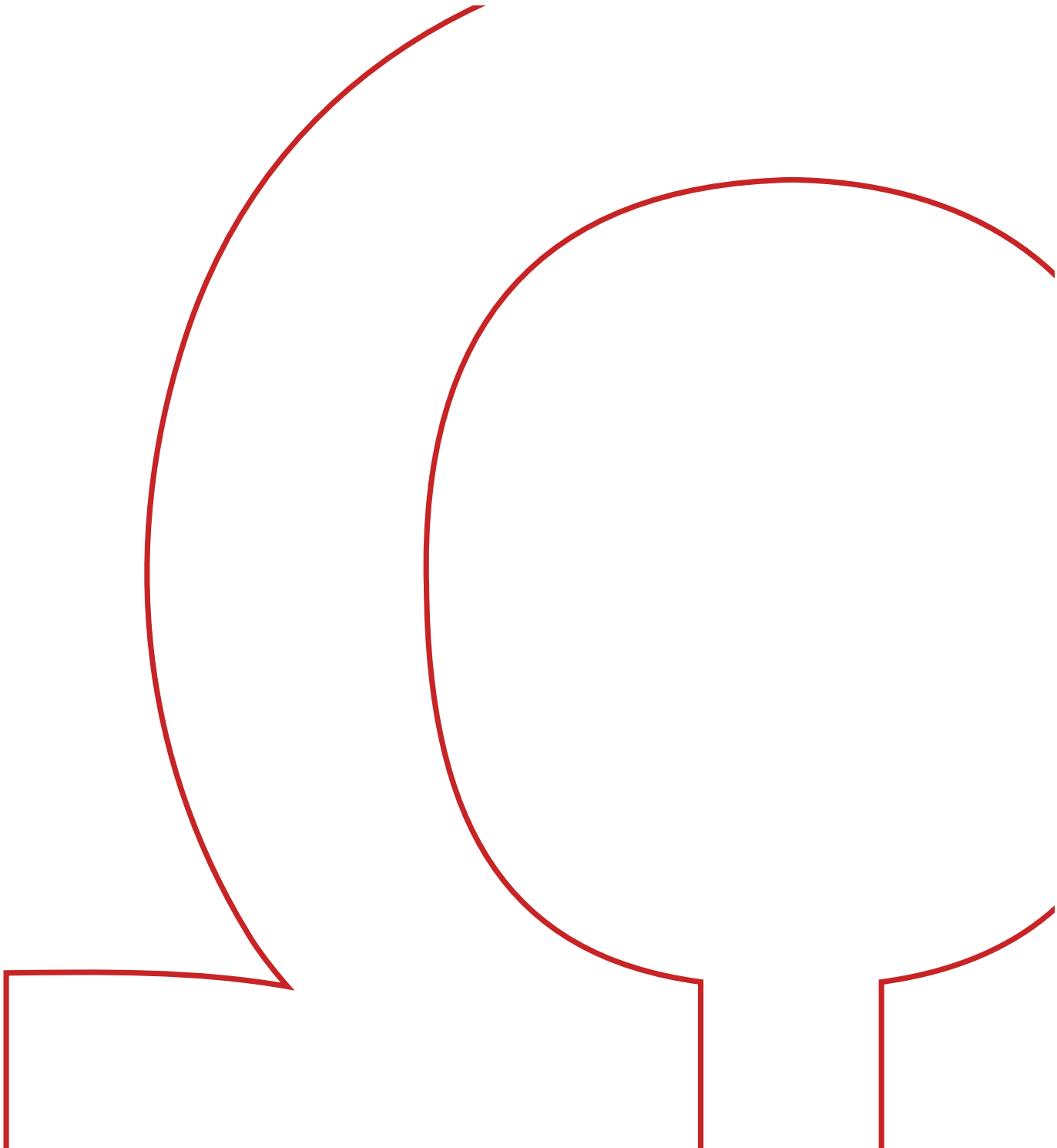


Studying Social Work in Nuremberg

Why Nuremberg? – City of Human Rights

Nuremberg is a vibrant and historic city in the heart of Bavaria, with about 500,000 inhabitants. It is well known for its cultural heritage, lively student life, and excellent connections within Germany and Europe. Importantly, Nuremberg is internationally recognised as the **City of Human Rights**. After its difficult history as the site of the Nazi party rallies and the Nuremberg Trials, the city has reinvented itself as a place of peace, reconciliation, and justice.

- The **Nuremberg Trials** marked a milestone in international law and continue to shape human rights discourse worldwide.
- Today, Nuremberg hosts the **International Nuremberg Human Rights Award** and the **Nuremberg Human Rights Center**, keeping this tradition alive.
- Students will find many opportunities to engage with issues of democracy, diversity, and human rights in everyday academic and city life.

For students of social work, Nuremberg provides a unique learning environment where human rights, history, practice, and values come together.

Courses in English

We offer a variety of courses taught in English, open to international students. The current **course catalogue** of classes taught in English is available online.

The core module for our incoming students is **Social Work in Germany**. This module includes:

- A field placement in a local social work institution (ca. 2 days per week)
- Accompanying supervision by faculty members
- The option to complete the module entirely in English

Practical Experience

The field placement is an excellent opportunity to gain first-hand insights into German social work practice and institutions. Fields of practice may include child and youth services, migration and integration work, community work, or health and disability services.

Requirements

- German or English language proficiency at a minimum level of B1
- Depending on the placement institution an official certificate of good conduct might be required
